II. Election of Officers

Member Carter nominated Kyle Palmer to serve as Committee Chair and Member April Newton to serve as Committee Vice Chair. The motion was seconded by Member Freilinger. There were no other nominations or discussion and the motion passed unanimously (11-0).

III. Approval of the Minutes from the Meeting Held on May 15, 2018

 Member Smith made a motion to approve the minutes from the meeting held on May 15, 2018. Member Freilinger seconded the motion. There was no discussion and the motion passed 9-0, with Members Neideigh and Yeates abstaining.

IV. Presentation of the Budget Message and Review of the Budget Document

Agency Director Christy Wurster presented the budget message for the FY 2019-2020 Silverton Urban Renewal Agency (URA). The URA was created in November 29, 2004 to promote the valuation growth within the Silverton Urban Renewal boundary. She said there have been many notable projects that can be seen in the downtown area of Silverton. The administration for the URA is handled by City staff. The total budget for the agency is \$2,176,977. Staff has budgeted for an increase in property taxes and \$50,000 for the Small Grants Program. In addition, \$1,702,563 has been budgeted in the URA projects

line item to be used for projects the Urban Renewal Advisory Committee (URAC) recommends and the Agency Board approves. Of the budgeted amount, over \$965,326.53 is obligated for eight different entities approved projects. The Agency did approve a boundary expansion and the URA and the URAC are reviewing the policies and guidelines that establish how money is distributed through this fund. In closing, Agency Director Wurster thanked the members for their time spent reviewing the budget and serving on the Budget Committee, as well as City staff who prepared the budget.

Committee Questions:

Member Yeates asked if the downtown trees are budgeted through the URA. Agency Director Wurster indicated that they are managed through the Urban Forestry Program in the City budget. Member Benedict verified that the grants distributed are for building upgrades not for the actual business itself. Agency Director Wurster said that is correct and explained how the incremental tax revenue is received and how property owners apply for funding. Member Yeates asked if there is bonding authority with the Urban Renewal District. Finance Director Kathleen Zaragoza responded yes, there is bonding authority, but is not being utilized currently.

Member Carter asked for a status update on Mo Salem's project located at 100 S Water Street, because it is listed in both the budgeted items for the upcoming fiscal year and in the accomplishments through April 30, 2019. Agency Director Wurster said the grant was for \$40,000 and the \$24,811.71 listed in the accomplishments is what has been reimbursed to-date. There is no obligation for him to open a business at that location; the grant award was for a façade improvement. The agency is refining the program guidelines and is looking at including a time constraint moving forward for project completion.

There was no public comment on the Proposed FY 2019-2020 URA Budget.

Member Freilinger made a motion to approve the Silverton Urban Renewal Agency Budget for the 2019-2020 fiscal year in the amount of \$2,176,977 and to levy 100% of the taxes available. Member Carter seconded the motion. Member Sears asked if the Agency had to make a motion to receive the state revenue sharing for general fund purposes. Finance Director Zaragoza explained that is not an urban renewal option. Member Benedict asked if the motion means the URA plans to expend the entire amount within this fiscal year. Finance Director Zaragoza explained the URA will spend the obligated amount of \$965,326.53 as long as the City receives submitted receipts. The other portion could be spent if the URAC presents to the Agency Board further projects for their approval. There was no further discussion and the motion passed unanimously (11-0).
